- Activity Objectives**
- ☑ Understand the division of functional areas in a room and the functions of various facilities.
 - ☑ Explore the size and structure of a bed through comparison.

Activity Description You will play a hide-and-seek game with children centered on the room to help them learn about different functional areas inside. The focus of this activity is the bedroom—children will learn the function of the bedroom, explore the structure of the bed (the most important item in the bedroom), and build a bed of appropriate size through comparison.

Interactive Tips

- To help children understand that beds come in different sizes, when choosing a suitable bed, refer to factors like a person's height and weight.
- When comparing, remind children to pay attention to length and width. You can directly use the base plates in the building block set for comparison, as this makes construction easier.
- Beds now have a variety of structures—some have no bed legs. Children can build these parts according to their own ideas.
