Applicable Age Group 3-4 year-old toddlers

- Activity Objectives**
- ☑ Observe the shapes and colors of the building blocks, then imagine and create unique gift shapes.
 - ☑ Learn to identify forward, backward, and turning directions.

Activity Description Children will recognize and understand the basic shapes, colors and sizes of building blocks, and develop a preliminary understanding of the concept of "exchange" and its significance in social interactions. Through building block construction activities, children's hand-eye coordination, spatial imagination, creativity, and problem-solving abilities will be developed.

Interactive Tips

- Show children physical gift boxes or pictures, and let them observe the shape, color and structural characteristics of the gift boxes.
- Encourage children to imagine what the gift box they want to build looks like—it can be big, small, tall, short, or a combination of different colors.
- Guide children to first use a few rectangular blocks to form a stable base. When using rectangular blocks to build the sides, ensure they are perpendicular to the base and parallel to each other.
- Encourage children to decorate with blocks of different colors and shapes to make the gift box more beautiful.
